

# Student Driver Log Book\*

## How to assemble your driving log booklet

1. Print 1 copy of "Student Driver Log Book Cover PDF" file in portrait mode and fold it in half so you have a front and back to your book.
2. Print "Student Driver Log Book Inside Pages PDF" file in landscape mode. Print as many inside pages as you think you will need. Each inside page printed gives you 12 entries per page/24 entries per sheet.

### Option 1

Print the inside pages on one side of paper, cut the pages in half, place them all facing up and insert them into your cover. Then staple the binding of the book to secure the pages but also make sure you can read and write in the date column inside the book.

### Option 2

Print on both sides of the paper (set your printer to flip on the short side of the paper). Then stack the pages, fold them in half and insert them into your printed cover and staple. You and your student will be able to write on the front and back of the pages if you print double sided.

### Notes

Keep your log book and a pen in the glove box or in a safe place so you can use it every time your student practices driving.

My state requires 100 hours of practice driving or 50 hours of practice driving if the student also takes an approved driver's education training. Double check to see what is required for your state.

\*This log book is not an official book or document from the Department of Motor Vehicles, or Department of Transportation, it is just a handy way to track the date, skills practiced, day or night driving, start and end time, total driving time, initials of student and adult, and to track the total drive time overall.

Make sure you check with your local Motor Vehicle Department to see if any specific documentation is needed to track during your student's driving practice.
